

Best Practice-I

Title of the practice:

"Establishment and effective implementation of various associations/cells at the institutional level".

Thus the whole system from top to the bottom level is activated for the better achievements. It enhances the active participation of every individual and thus the team work is achieved. The context:

There were few associations/cells/forums being active at the college level earlier. They use to function separately in their own method. They had their own aims and objectives. In that context, It was not possible to evaluate their outcomes. Moreover some associations were less effective than others. Since they had been coordinated to each other, it has becomes easy to work and evaluate their efficiency.

The Practice :

Internal Quality Assurance Cell:

The establishment of internal Quality Assurance cell is to monitor, evaluate, facilitate and guide the performance of the faculty, students and non-teaching staff leading to Quality enhancement. It moderates the quality of higher education throughout the Institution. The cell motivates the teachers to the undertake research projects. It takes persistent follow up the UGC schemes for development and tries to implement it in the college. It involves all the cells in the development and enhancement of quality in the college.

Extension Activities:

There is a centralized moderation of the extension activities like NSS, NCC, Sports and guides. The college authorities not only compels the respective cells to conduct the scheduled activities but also motivates to undertake other occasional and special activities like innovative projects, blood donation camps, awareness camps, National Integration Programmes etc.

Grievance and Redressal Cell

The cell invites the complaints and grievances of the faculty in all the phases of the college and Students. These grievances are clearly stated and submitted to the committee. The concerned person is invited if necessary in front of the committee and given an opportunity to state grievances. In very impartial and transparent manner that grievances are resolved.

Examination committee

The centralized examination committee conducts examinations in a very effective way. It strictly follows the rules and regulations of the university. There is uniformly of question paper patterns and total execution of the examination process. This practice automatically leads to the assurance of better quality in internal assessment tests and University semester examinations.

Women Empowerment Cell :

The cell works for empowerment of women in all respects. It takes several critical social issues like "save the girl child" for its lecture program and creates awareness among women. It conducts several competitions for female students of the college throughout the year. Eminent personalities are invited as chief guest on several occasions who speak on women empowerment.

Planning forum :

The planning forum conducts several activities throughout the every academic year on economic related activities such as Quiz, Elocution competition, Group Discussion, Guest Lectures, Industrial Visits, Critical Analysis of Central Budget, Internet Banking and other National Development and socio economic activities.

Evidence of success

- Better quality is achieved and maintained due to IQAC and few minor projects are ongoing and some are completed.
- Best results are seen at the college. One student stood first rank to university by securing 91.60% and another student stood sixth rank to university by securing 89.16% with gold medals during 2013. During 2015 examinations of the University, two students have secured Gold Medals and Economics & Applied Statistics respectively.
- Students are getting good placements and facing challenges successfully.
- Due to the effective execution of extension activities the college as a whole is reaching out to the society.
- Due to the impartial resolutions of grievances there is healthy atmosphere in the college.
- Planning forum conducted several economic related activities which created an internet and awareness in National development and socio-economic problems to which they belong.
- Due to effective implementation of woman empowerment programmes, there is a healthy atmosphere among girl students of the college.

Problems encountered and resources required ;

• Initially it was difficult to link up all the associations / cell / forums functioning. Due to distribution of work to various units through IQAC it proved its utility in the course of time. Resource required is borne by either university or institution or management.

• This practice always keeps better coordination and healthy atmosphere between management, staff and students. The outcome of the practice has given better results.

Best Practice - II

Title of the Best Practice :
