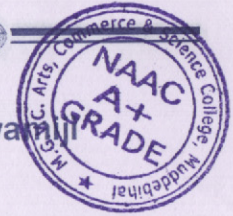

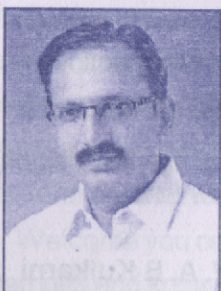

### Library

The college is proud of the rich collection of books, journals and periodicals in its library. In all there are 34,959 books worth of Rs. 19.50 lakhs and also there are 10,775 books worth Rs. 11 lakhs from UGC grants. It supplements the learning process of the students and teachers. The library has a reading room facility with periodicals, news papers, reference section, book bank reprography and network resource centre. Apart from these the library provides text books to meritorious and needy students which they can use for a year. The library budget is utilized carefully not only to buy text books but also to enrich it with academically updated reading materials.

### Laboratories

Our college has well equipped laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Bio technology, Statistics, Geography language and Computer subjects. The Botanical garden of the college, besides serving the study requirements of the Botany department, has beautified the college campus with its green natural environment.

### Cultural Activities Forum

The students of our college are mostly having rural background. They possess naturally varied mental, emotional and cultural talents. This Forum is the right platform to bring out and exhibit these talents. Debating and essay-writing competitions, quiz, singing songs, entertainment programmes are conducted by the Forum.

### Sports Dept

Our College has wide playground with all the facilities for outdoor and indoor games. The dept. has well qualified Physical director various sports activities are conducted in the college. The dept. has an indoor, outdoor stadium and a gym facilities. Special support is given to outstanding men.

### NSS/ NCC/ Scouts/ Guides

College has units like NSS, NCC & Scout and Guides. These units strive to enhance the social service and spirit of leading the nation in promoting national integrity among the students.

### Alumni Association

This association brings together all the stake holders of our college on one platform to facilitate the progress of the group of students of today and future.

### Human Rights Forum

Human Rights Forum established in our college on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2009. It creates Human Rights awareness among students. We have organized series of programs for students by inviting experts, Judges, lawyers and university professors.

### Kannada Sangha

### Science Forum

The Science Forum has come into existence in the year 1987. It is also the member of the Karnataka State Science Parishat. The Forum is celebrating the National Science Day on 28<sup>th</sup> February every year. It also conducts Quiz, Essay competitions, Seminars in which the students are taking active participation. The eminent personalities in the various Science subjects are invited to deliver the guest Lectures through the Forum.

Thus, the Science Forum of our college is creating awareness in Science and developing scientific mind in the students.

### Planning Forum

With the main objectives of creating awareness in the minds of the students about India's Five year plans and their appraisal of progress made, the Planning Forum was established in our college in the year 1976. Since then the Forum has been active in arranging special Guest Lectures conducting Seminars, Symposia, Elocution, Industrial Visit and Quiz competitions for the benefit of the students. 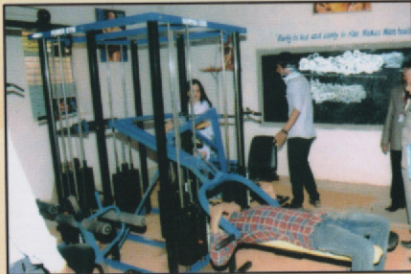
