## STUDY TOUR REPORT

The study tour is necessary and is compulsory according to syllabus for B.Sc (CBZ) degree students, because it gives an idea to study the activities of organisms in their natural habitats. To study different fauna and flora, the Zoology department arranged educational one day study tour with the permission of our beloved principal in the month of November -2025 to visit natural habitats of organisms. For that we had been to Anjanadri Betta, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Zoological Park at Kamalapur, Hampi and Hospet on 14.11.2025. About 47 students were accompanied by Prof. K.G.Hiremath and Smt.S.L.Madiwalar. We left Muddebihal at 6.30am and we reached Anjanadri Betta at 9.30am.

### Anjanadri Betta or Hill:

Anjanadri betta lies in Hanumanahalli near Hampi. It is believed to be the birth place of the Hindu deity Hanuman. It is located in Gangavati Taluk, Koppal District of Karnataka. The hill has Hanuman temple at the top. It has about 575 steps. A red flag flutters atop the tower, visible from afar, serving as a beacon of devotion and faith. The spectacular views from the hill top of the Paddy fields, coconut plantations. The rocky mountains on one side and the Tungabhadra on the other side. The betta is home to a large population of monkeys like rhesus macaque and Gray Lungurs. This area holds immense historical and religious significance. Throughout the day the temple resonates with the sound of prayers, hymns and the ringing of bells, creating a symphony of devotion that uplifts the spirits of all who visit.

In the temple, there is a remarkable sight, a stone floating in water within a large glass box. This stone holds a special significance as it is believed to be one of the stones used by Lord Rama to build the legendary bridge between Srilanka and India. Anjanadri hill is blessed with awe-inspiring natural beauty, making it a haven for nature lovers and trekking enthusiasts alike. The hill is enveloped by lush greenery with vibrant flora adorning its slopes. From Anjanadri hill we went to Atal Bihari Vajpayee Zoological Park at Kamalapur.

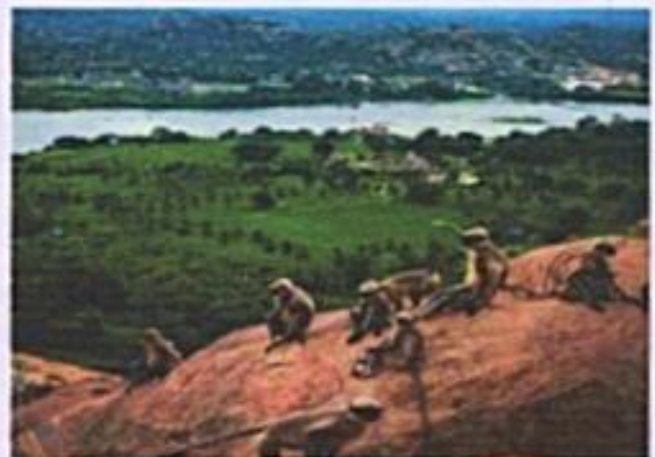

**Atal Bihari Vajpayee Zoological Park:**

The Atal Bihari Vajpayee Zoological Park is also known as the Hampi Zoo and located in the Hospet Taluk, Vijayanagara District, of Karnataka. It is near the village of Kamalapur, in the Bilikal West Reserve Forest area, within the administrative boundaries of the Vijayanagara district of Karnataka. This Zoo is established in November 2017 and covers an area of approximately 141 hectares (350 acres). The Zoological Park aims to inspire conservation efforts. Its mission is to “inspire children and adults to learn and act on behalf of wildlife to conserve nature and natural resources”. The park focuses on Ex-situ conservation, Conservation education, and the rescue and Rehabilitation of wild animals. One of the park’s main highlights is the Safari, offering visitors a chance to see animals like Tigers and Lions in a more naturalistic setting. It is recognized as the state’s third Tiger and Lion Safari.

The Zoo section houses a diverse collection of fauna, including:

**Mammals:** Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Bear, Hyena, Spotted Deer, Jackal, Hippopotamus, Giraffe, etc.

**Reptiles:** Crocodiles and various species of Turtles.

**Birds:** This Park includes more than 80 species of birds. The birds like, Ostrich, Emu, Black Ducks and different species of Parrots. In park we also observed Termite mounds.

After looking the Zoological Park we went to visit a historical place Hampi.

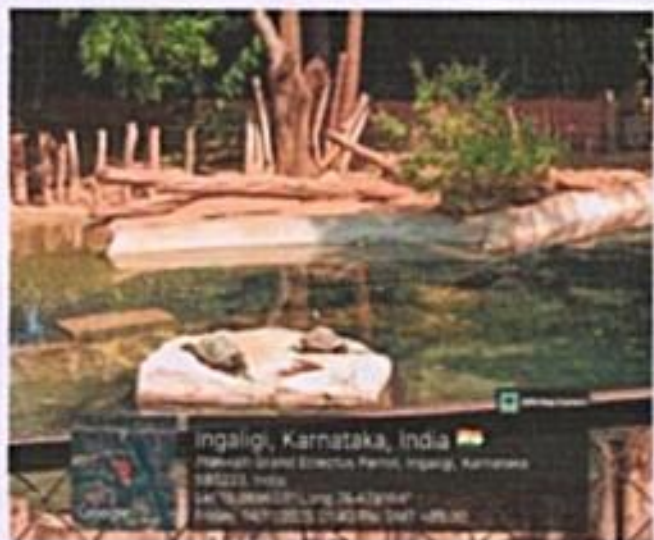

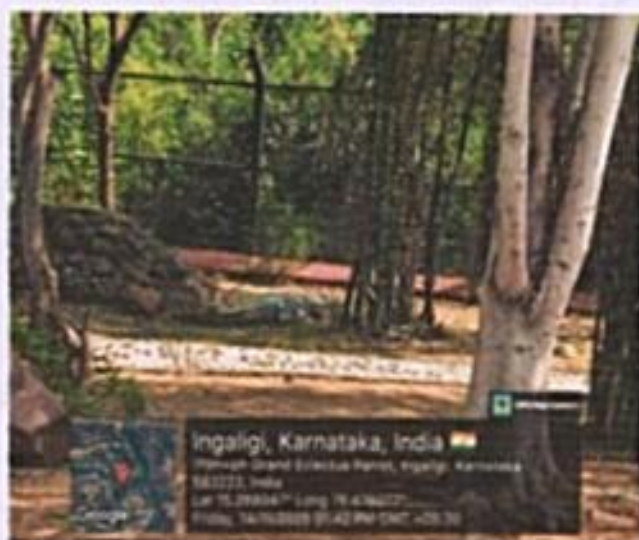

### Hampi:

Hampi is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and former capital of the Vijayanagara Empire from 1336-1565. It is located in Vijayanagara district of Karnataka. Hampi is a village, which spreads over 4,100 hectares.

This place is situated on the bank of River Tungabhadra. The hills like Matanga, Malyavanta and Anjaneya, wrap this historical place on three sides and on the other side flows the Tungabhadra River. Hampi is famous for its vast collection of ruins, temples, palaces, market streets and monuments which showcase the peak of the Hindu culture of the south between the 14<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> centuries. Hampi includes notable structures such as Virupaksha Temple, Vijaya-Vittal Temple, Ugranaransinh statue, famous stone chariot, etc. Virupaksha Temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva. The Gopura of Virupaksha Temple is a grand structure that stands 165 feet tall, 120ft deep and 150ft wide. The Gopura was cited as one of the tallest in southern India. After visiting historical place Hampi we visited Hospet to see the garden and musical fountain. At 8.30pm we left Hospet and reached Muddebihal at 12.30am.
